Present at the meeting called at 1:01 p.m. at the place above designated were: Charlie Pitigliano, presiding, Robert Clark, Pat Nunes, Robert Uchita, Sherry Champagne and Stan Creelman. Also present at the Board Meeting were John Avila, District Manager, and Chad M. Lew, counsel for the District.

Agenda Item No. 1: Citizen Comments.

Charlie Pitigliano opened the floor to citizen comments, but there were no comments from the public.

Agenda Item No. 2: Review Minutes of September 11, 2018, Board of Trustees Meeting. The minutes of the meeting held on September 11, 2018, were presented to the board in writing and reviewed. Upon a motion made by Pat Nunes, seconded by, Robert Uchita, and unanimously carried, the minutes of the meeting held on September 11, 2018, were approved as presented.

Agenda Item No. 3: Additions / Approval of Agenda.

There were no additions to the agenda.

Agenda Item No. 4: Payment of Check Number 5470 - 5519, Electronic Fund Transfers (EFTPS) from Union Bank to the IRS for Social Security, Medicare and Federal Tax Payments and Union Bank Charges and Credits, Claim Number 21910 Transfer of Funds from Tulare County Fund #778 to Union Bank Account.

The board members reviewed the District's Union Bank checking account, check numbers 5470 - 5519, the electronic fund transfers (EFTPS) for payment of Social Security, Medicare and Federal Tax Payments to the IRS, and the electronic debit payments from the District's Union Bank account and Claim Number 21910 which is a transfer of District funds from Tulare County Fund to the District's Union Bank account. John presented the information he obtained from the carrier related to coverage of the District aircraft. The board advised John that they were not concerned with Hull coverage on the airplane, but wanted to have liability insurance in place related to the airplane. John indicated that he would

follow up with the carrier about getting a quote for liability coverage on the airplane.

Agenda Item No. 7: 45 Day Comment Period District's Amendment of COI Chad provided an update to the board as to the progress and status of the District's amendment of the Conflict of Interest Code.

Agenda Item No. 8: Status of Invasive Aedes in the City of Tulare and State of California. John provided the board with a review of the invasive aedes species. In particular, he advised the board that there were a total of 81 Aegypti mosquitoes were collected this season in the District and 48 were sent to DART for Bottle Bioassay resistence testing and 33 Aegypti were collected and sent to Anton @ UC Davis Mosquito Research Laboratory. He also review with the board the District and Statewide West Nile Virus activity.

Agenda Item No. 9: SDRMA Letter to Board of Directors.

John reviewed with the board correspondence from SDRMA dated September 13, 2018, that advised the District that it had no "paid" property/liability claims for program year 2017-18.

Agenda Item No. 10: Polling of 3 Board of Directors Up for Reappointment on December 31, 2018. 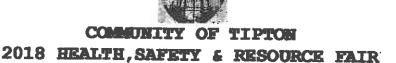

## Aedes aegypti Knockdown Resistance (kdr) Assay Results 2018

Aedes aegypti knockdown resistance (kdr) to pyrethroid and pyrethrin insecticides has been associated with naturally-occurring mutations at the 1016 and 1534 positions of the Ae. aegypti sodium channel gene. These genetic mutations prevent pyrethroids/pyrethrins from acting on the mosquito nervous system, and thus resistant mosquitoes can survive exposure to the insecticides. The two assays, or tests, performed by CDPH-VBDS screen each Ae. aegypti specimen individually for specific mutations at the 1016 and 1534 genetic positions. The assays allow for the determination of different forms of the genes, also known as alleles. 1016 and 1534 alleles are labeled susceptible (S) or resistant (R) according to assay results. Each mosquito has two copies of the gene at each position, and the genetic composition of each mosquito is known as its genotype. Therefore, possible mosquito genotypes are homozygous susceptible (SS), heterozygous (SR), or homozygous resistant (RR) as determined for each position.

**Samples:** To-date in 2018, CDPH-VBDS received a total of 48 *Aedes aegypti* specimens from Tulare MAD for pesticide resistance testing. Results are summarized in this report.

**Group 1 Assay Results:** The overall allelic frequency of resistant mutations for this submission group was 98% for the 1016 assay and 100% for the 1534 assay. These results show that *Ae. aegypti* in these sampled areas of Tulare County have genetic traits that could produce pyrethroid/pyrethrin resistance. Caution must be taken in the interpretation of these results as functional resistance in the field cannot be determined conclusively without assays of living mosquitoes, such as field trials using select adulticides.

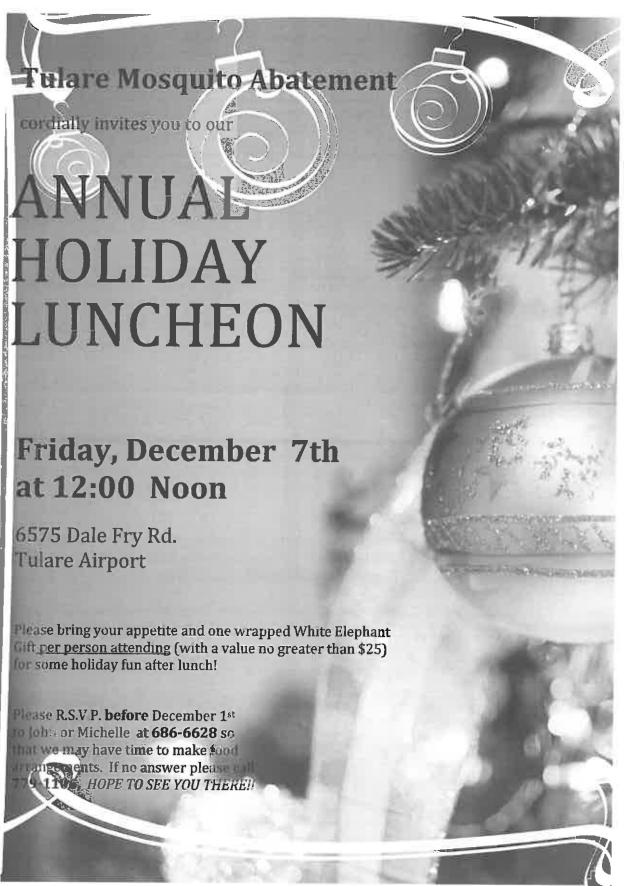
**Tables and Figures:** Genotypes of analyzed specimens, in association with their collection site codes, are provided in the tables below for the 1016 and 1534 assays. The accompanying figures illustrate the location of the sampled collection site (black dot) within Tulare MADs jurisdiction and the relative proportions of S and R alleles is shown by the pie chart labeled "Agency" at the side of the map.

Pesticide resistance management strategies could reduce selection for resistant traits, and these approaches may include (1) product rotation, (2) application of mixtures of insecticide classes, (3) mosaic applications of insecticides, and (4) implementation of multiple intervention types in infested areas. Note that applications of pyrethroids and pyrethrins targeting *Culex* mosquitoes or insects other than mosquitoes in Tulare County may contribute to development of resistance mechanisms in *Ae. aegypti* mosquitoes. Continued testing will help monitor changes in the distribution of resistant and susceptible genotypes across collection sites.
